COST OF PROVIDING PAID ANNUAL LEAVE TO ALL "REGULAR" CASUAL EMPLOYEES

The total cost to Australia's employers of granting paid leave entitlements to all 'regular' casual employees in addition to all of their current remuneration and entitlements will be somewhere between \$5.7 billion and \$8.0 billion, depending on the definition of 'regular' work that is developed and applied.

These estimates of the total cost impact are based on the latest available ABS and HILDA data which show:

- 2.6 million casual employees in May 2018 ("employees with no paid leave entitlements"), including:
 - o 823,151 employees without leave entitlements who worked full-time; and
 - **1,814,200** employees without leave entitlements who worked part-time;
- 61% of all casual employees have worked 'regular shifts' for 6 months or more with their current employer; and
- **Up to 85%** of all casual employees work on a 'regular' basis for their current employer, based on a range of statistical measures of 'regular' work.

The number of casual employees that will be affected will be between 1.6 million and 2.2 million, depending on the definition of 'regular' work that is developed and applied.
